<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> State-funded full-time-equivalent (FTE) student enrollments for each academic term are the sum of state-funded undergraduate-level (0-499) course credit hours attempted divided by 15 and state-funded graduate-level (500+) course credit hours attempted divided by 10. Annual average state-funded FTE student enrollments are calculated by dividing the sum of state-funded term FTEs at quarter-system institutions by three and by dividing the sum of state-funded term FTEs at semester-system institutions by two. Budgeted enrollment is derived from the Legislature's authorized enrollment level, but does not include all enrollment activity.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> The figures in this column come from the 2015-17 Operating Budget Bill (ESSB 6052). This is the last time on record that these numbers were adjusted.
